

Dani Garcia Hosts InteractIV: A Representation of Isla Vista

ISLA VISTA, CA - December 11th, 2014 - A third year student at the University of California, Santa Barbara, Dani Garcia announced today that she will be hosting a series of interactive art events in the college town next to UCSB, Isla Vista. These events will be held the first saturday of the months January through May, and will be located at different places each month, but all within the small Isla Vista community. Students and families alike will be able to contribute to these works for a few hours and leave their mark on this beach town.

Dani Garcia's "InteractIV" is the first interactive art series to take place in Isla Vista. There have been smaller art projects hosted by Isla Vista Arts, but nothing too substantial that uses the mixture of backgrounds and ethnicities that is IV. The specific dates will be January 3rd, February 7th, March 7th, April 4th, and May 2nd, each held respectively at their own location. In order, the locations are Pardall tunnel, Camino Pescadero Park, Window-to-the-Sea Park, 6568 Sabado Tarde Rd., and Trigo-Pasado Park.

Dani Garcia has already held the first interactive art exhibit at an event in Isla Vista called First Fridays, a late night art and culture event that is essentially an alternative to the regular Friday night in IV. She painted and prepared a large piece of wood that became the "Family Tree of Isla Vista", where individuals passing by could contribute by placing their hand in a certain hue of green paint, and sticking it onto the tree truck. The event was a huge success and lasted from 9pm until 11pm on Friday, December 5th, and the piece of art is currently on display outside of her residence in Isla Vista.

About Dani Garcia

Dani Garcia is originally from San Diego but is currently residing in Isla Vista, California. She is somewhat of an artist, as she has been a dancer for most of her life and sometimes dabbled in painting and sculptures, but is not quite a professional. Currently her only exhibition that is in place at at her residence in San Diego, where her mother Angela Lopez curated Dani Garcia's past works of art from 1st grade up until 12th grade. It is a private exhibition, and only those close to her have seen these secret masterpieces.
